



Careers Case Study

Blueprint - Year Group: 11

Challenges:

- Student X joined Blueprint towards the end of year 11. She has previously been living in Pakistan for nearly 2 years after being sent there by her family, therefore she missed a lot of education.
- As she had been out of education for a couple of years, she was not registered with any schools to sit GCSE exams.
- Parents did not want her to come to Blueprint.
- X only had a short period of time in which to gain qualifications.

Interventions from Aspire:

- Initially met the student and parents at home to explain what we can offer X.
- Agreement made with a local training provider to offer FS English, which needs to be completed within 6 weeks.
- Picked up the student from home and took for an initial meeting at a local training provider
- X was put on a 2pm to 3pm timetable, so she would receive one to one tuition for Core and cooking.
- Meetings were arranged at home to discuss and complete applications for Aylesbury College.
- Regular contact was made between Blueprint and parents, in order to keep them up to date.

Successes:

- She flourished at Blueprint and staff said she was a pleasure to teach.
- She achieved FS qualifications in Maths at Blueprint in a short period of time.
- She achieved FS English at a local training provider.
- Gaining these qualifications gave her the opportunity to join Aylesbury College and study towards her chosen career in health and social care.
- She has been offered the opportunity to move onto a Level 3 qualification from September 2026.

• Outcomes:

- Move onto Aylesbury College after Year 11 to continue her education.
- Achieved both FS English and Maths, which met the entry requirements.
- During her time at College she studied passed her GCSE in Maths.
- Gained more confidence in her ability.
- She has become very focused on what she wants to achieve and her goals.
